- ❖ If both parents have a FT purpose for care, the child is eligible for FT care.
- ❖ If one parent is under 20 hours but the 2nd parent is working additional hours to supplement, the child is eligible for PT care as long as the hours from both parents added together equals 40.
- ❖ If one parent is under the 20 hours and the 2nd parent is *not* working enough additional hours to make up the difference, then the parents in combination are *not* making 40 hours together. They DO NOT qualify for services.
